Thorhild School Council May 2022-Trustee's Report

We are planning an Indigenous Flag raising ceremony at Division Office in June.

Aspen View held their annual staff recognition awards in Thorhild May 6.

We had a presentation from the Technology Department at the last Board meeting. Schools and divisions are under attach 24/7/365 and cyber security has had a significant impact on our insurance. We need to remember that we cannot sacrifice security for convenience. AVPS moved to a VOIP phone system that will allow up to 60 simultaneous phone calls to accommodate Parent Teacher phone interviews. This moved saved 60% in phone costs. New wireless tech across the division has shown a savings of \$115k.

We are doing our Board and Superintendent Evaluations in house, completed May 16.

Rochester Viability process resulted in a unanimous vote to not close the school. Subsequent motion:

Chairman Nikipelo moved that the Board of Trustees of Aspen View Public Schools continue to operate Rochester School for the 2022-2023 school year. Further that administration provide enrollment numbers as of September 30, 2022 and a discussion will be held and a path forward for Rochester School be determined effective the 2023-2024 school year.

TCS hosted the first Annual Robotics Tournament May 11. There were over 300 students competing that day. Very excited to see the division continue this tournament next year.

TCS's own Taylor Vaughan is AVPS nominee for the Edwin Parr first year teacher award. Although she is already a winner to us, we wish her luck at the banquet May 27.








Response Rate by Grade







How well do you feel you understand high school courses and streams?





Do you know what courses you need to earn a high school diploma or certificate of achievement?




How do you feel about your own high school program plan?
















Are you able to access your marks through PowerSchool?




How familiar are you with MyPass?




How often have you used MyBlueprint?






Have you discussed career options with your parents/guardians?




Do you know who to go to in your school to talk about courses or career planning?




What do you plan to do in the year after you graduate?




Do you plan to attend post-secondary at some point?




Have you ever attended a career fair (either in-person or virtually) and would you like to attend more?
