Learn to ride the bus: Other divisions do this for kindergarten students. A program designed for first time bus riders to be comfortable with their travels and orientate them with the process. This is a Aspen View level decision.
- 7.6 Supporting community events: It is suggested that the school be open a bit more for community organizations to use, adult sports, and other group that may have use the facility. There are new user agreements in place for groups to use the school. This would need to be updated for all groups.
- 7.7 In person book fair: It was asked if the school could look at holding the spring book fair in person as the fall one is online. School Council can help with volunteers.

Learned that the cost of MELT training has been lowered to \$5000, the Minister is working with Transportation to see if there is more that can be done. School buses can now travel at posted highway speed limits.

Trustee Lutz has resigned from Ward 1. Brenda Fulmore was acclaimed in the bi-election.

AVPS is at 2655 students, up 144 from last year's enrolment (up 135 from projections).
